**NOTICE** is hereby given that at the Annual General Meeting **WARILLA BOWLS & RECREATION CLUB LIMITED** to be held on **9 SEPTEMBER 2018** commencing at the hour of **9.30AM** at the premises of the Club, Jason Avenue, Barrack Heights, New South Wales, the members will be asked to consider and if thought fit pass the three (3) Special Resolutions set out below:

**FIRST SPECIAL RESOLUTION**

*[The First Special Resolution is to be read in conjunction with the notes to members set out below]*

That the Constitution of Warilla Bowls and Recreation Club Limited be amended by:

**inserting** the following new Rule 10.2(e):

*“(e) Social Bowling members.”*

**inserting** the following new heading and new Rules 10.24 to 10.27 inclusive:

**“SOCIAL BOWLING MEMBERS**

*10.24 Social Bowling members shall be persons who have attained the age of eighteen (18) years and are elected to or transferred to Social Bowling membership of the Club.*

*10.25 Social Bowling members shall pay such joining fee (if any) and annual subscription as the Board may determine from time to time.*

*10.26 Social Bowling members are entitled to:*

- (a) such playing and social privileges and advantages of the Club as the Board may determine from time to time;*
- (b) vote in the election of the Board; and*
- (c) introduce guests to the Club.*

*10.27 Social Bowling members are not entitled to*

- (a) attend and vote at Annual General Meetings and general meetings of the Club;*
- (b) nominate for and be elected to hold office on the Board;*
- (c) vote on any special resolution to amend this Constitution;*
- (d) propose, second, or nominate any eligible member for any office of the Club; or*

- (e) *propose, second or nominate any eligible member for Life membership.*
- (b) **inserting** into Rule 15.1 the words, “*Social Bowling member*” after the words “*Bowling member*”.

#### **Notes to Members on the First Special Resolution**

1. The Board has recently been considering the Club’s membership structure and the possible introduction of a new category of membership with less bowling rights than Bowling Members but more bowling rights than Social Members.
  2. The First Special Resolution proposes to create a new category of membership of the Club to be known as “*Social Bowling Membership*”.
  3. The rights of Social Bowling members are set out in the First Special Resolution above (proposed new Rules 10.24 and 10.27).
  4. In effect, Social Bowling Members will have the same rights and privileges as Social Members of the Club however they will have more bowling rights than Social Members.
  5. The precise bowling rights of Social Bowling members will be determined by the Board from time to time. This will provide the Board with flexibility. However, it is intended that Social Bowling members will only be entitled to play in casual bowling events (and not in events organised under the auspices of the Royal NSW Bowling Association or the NSW Women’s Bowling Association).

#### **SECOND SPECIAL RESOLUTION**

*[The Second Special Resolution is to be read in conjunction with the notes to members set out below]*

That the Constitution of Warilla Bowls and Recreation Club Limited be amended by:

**inserting** the following new Rule 24.5:

*“Any person who is elected or appointed to the Board, must, unless exempted, complete such mandatory training requirements for directors as required by the Regulations made under the Registered Clubs Act”*

**deleting** Rules 28 to 30 inclusive and the headings before those Rules and in lieu thereof **inserting** the following new headings and Rules 28 to 30 inclusive:

**“28. MATERIAL PERSONAL INTERESTS OF DIRECTORS**

- 28.1 *Any director who has a material personal interest in a matter that relates to the affairs of the Club must, as soon as practicable after the relevant facts have come to the director’s knowledge declare the nature of the interest at a meeting of the Board and comply with Rule 28.2.*
- 28.2 *Subject to Section 195 of the Act, a director who has a material personal interest in a matter that is being considered at a meeting of the Board, or of the Directors of the Club:*
- (a) must not vote on the matter; and*
  - (b) must not be present while the matter is being considered at the meeting.*

**29. REGISTERED CLUBS ACCOUNTABILITY CODE**

- 29.1. *The Club must comply with the requirements of the Registered Clubs Accountability Code (as amended from time to time) and the provisions of this Rule 29.*
- 29.2 *For the purposes of this Rule 29, the terms “close relative”, “controlling interest”, “manager”, “pecuniary interest” and “top executive” shall have the meanings assigned to them by the Registered Clubs Act and Registered Clubs Regulations.*

**Contracts With Top Executives**

- 29.3 *The Club must ensure that each top executive has entered into a written employment contract with the Club dealing with:*
- (a) the top executive’s terms of employment; and*
  - (b) the roles and responsibilities of the top executive;*
  - (c) the remuneration (including fees for service) of the top executive;*
  - (d) the termination of the top executive’s employment.*
- 29.4 *Contracts of employment with top executives will not have any effect until they approved by the Board and they must be reviewed by an independent and qualified adviser before they can be approved by the Board.*

**Contracts With Directors Or Top Executives**

- 29.5 *The Club must not enter into a commercial arrangement or a contract with a director or top executive or with a company or other body in which a director or top executive has a pecuniary interest, unless the proposed commercial arrangement or contract is first approved by the Board.*
- 29.6 *A “pecuniary interest” in a company for the purposes of Rule 29.5 does not include any interest exempted by the Registered Clubs Act.*

**Contracts With Secretary And Managers**

- 29.7 *Unless otherwise permitted by the Registered Clubs Act, the Club must not enter into a commercial arrangement or contract with:*
- (a) the Secretary or a manager; or*

- (b) any close relative of the Secretary or a manager;
- (c) any company or other body in which the Secretary or a manager or a close relative of the Secretary or a manager has a controlling interest.

### **Loans To Directors And Employees**

29.8 The Club must not:

- (a) lend money to a director of the Club; and
- (b) unless otherwise permitted by the Registered Clubs Act and Regulations, the Club must not lend money to an employee of the Club unless the amount of the proposed loan is ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or less and the proposed loan has first been approved by the Board.

### **Restrictions On The Employment Of Close Relatives Of Directors And Top Executives**

29.9 A person who is a close relative of a director or top executive must not be employed by the Club unless their employment is approved by the Board.

29.10 If a person who is being considered for employment by the Club is a close relative of a director of the Club, the director must not take part in any decision relating to the person's employment.

### **Disclosures By Directors And Employees Of The Club**

29.11 A director, top executive or employee of the Club must disclose any of the following matters to the Club to the extent that they relate to the director, top executive or employee:

- (a) any material personal interest that the director has in a matter relating to the affairs of the Club; and
- (b) any personal or financial interest of the director or top executive in a contract relating to the procurement of goods or services or any major capital works of the Club;
- (c) any financial interest of the director or top executive in a hotel situated within forty (40) kilometres of the Club's premises;
- (d) any gift (which includes money, hospitality and discounts) valued at one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more, or any remuneration (including any fees for service) of an amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more, received by the director, top executive or employee from an affiliated body of the club or from a person or body that has entered into a contract with the Club.

29.12 The Club must keep a register in an approved form containing details of the disclosures made to the Club in accordance with Rule 29.11.

### **Provision of Information To Members**

29.13 The Club must:

- (a) make the information required by the Registered Clubs Regulations available to the members of the club within four (4) months after the end of each reporting period to which the information relate; and



- (b) indicate, by displaying a notice on the Club's premises and on the Club's website (if any), how the members of the club can access the information.

**30. INTENTIONALLY Deleted.”**

**Notes to Members on Second Special Resolution**

1. The Second Special Resolution proposes two (2) amendments to the Club's Constitution to bring the Constitution into line with the *Registered Clubs Act* and *Registered Clubs Regulation*.
  2. **Paragraph (a)** inserts a reference to the requirements in the Registered Clubs Act and Registered Clubs Regulation relating to the mandatory training of Directors.
  3. **Paragraph (b)** amends existing provisions relating to corporate governance and accountability to bring the Constitution into line with the recent and significant amendments to the corporate governance and accountability provisions of the *Registered Clubs Act* and *Registered Clubs Regulation*.

The Club continues to be a force on the bowls scene on local, national and international levels and we now have two players (Jesse Noronha and Aaron Teys) in the Australian Jackaroos team, congratulations to them both, it's a great reward for their hard work and dedication.

To the Board of Directors thank you for your support during the year, to our General Manager Phillip Kipp and Operations Manager Dan Morris thank you both for a job well done and not forgetting our Management team, Administration staff and all other members of our staff who contribute to make this the great Club that it is.

Warilla Bowling Club now enjoys a worldwide reputation not only for our wonderful facilities but also for the friendliness of both the members and the staff and this is something that should make everyone proud to be a member or an employee.

To those members who are ill I wish you a speedy and complete recovery and to those who have lost a loved one during the past year I offer my deepest sympathy, they are never completely gone while ever you remember them.

Finally on behalf of the board thank you to all members for your continued support during the past year.

## GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

It is with pleasure that I present my report for the year ending 30 June 2018, a challenging trading year in which the Club posted a profit of \$149,820. The Club continues to maintain a strong balance sheet and remains in a sound financial position.

In spite of what historically may be considered a marginal trading year, mainly due to a downturn in gaming revenues, the Club continues to improve upon the facilities we provide for the enjoyment of our members and guests. This year saw the installation of a 314KW solar panel installation on the roof of the indoor green. This has, with the existing 100KW system, given the Club a 414KW system (the largest solar power installation of any Australian Club) which now provides around 27% of the power required to run the Club. However, at the same time electricity tariffs rose by around 40% when the current electricity supply contract was renewed at the end of last calendar year. Collective governments should hang their heads in shame as they preside over a country so rich in natural energy resources yet with the most expensive retail power costs on the planet.

During the year the Club purchased 57 Jason Avenue, after a delayed settlement period of eighteen months, completed a full renovation of the first floor function rooms and installed a 'return and earn' reverse vending machine in the Club carpark for the benefit of the local community.

The Club continues to support the local community, as well as local charity and sporting groups, with over \$250,000 being donated to these groups this past financial year. The Club takes great pride in the support we provide for the local community.

Looking ahead, the Board has been busily working on a new strategic planning cycle which, after extensive research and in response to the current challenges facing the business, will include the following capital works projects:

1. Gaming Lounge renovations – The Club has committed to renovations to the gaming lounge to be undertaken in the first half of the 2018/19 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1.2M;
2. Bowls Lounge redevelopment – The Club is well into the planning stages of a redevelopment of the existing bowls lounge. This project will also see new construction over the remaining synthetic green, comprising of an expansive indoor children's play area, a new Italian pizza/gelato restaurant and an expansive al fresco area overlooking number one green. It is envisaged that this project will commence sometime in the 2019 calendar year at an approximate cost of between \$3.5M to \$4M, subject to finalisation of the detail.

To Chairman Ian Prescott-Smith and the Board of Directors, thank you for your continued support. To our Operations Manager Dan Morris, thank you for your tireless assistance. To our Finance Manager Tracy Girardot and our administration staff, your efforts, as always, are very much appreciated. To our Management team, thank you for inspiring our staff to provide exceptional service to our members and guests. To our Executive Chef Adam Southwell and the catering team, our catering operation continues to impress with the quality of food and everyone in that team should be very proud of the reputation our food has deservedly earned. To all our staff, in every area of the Club, the service you provide our patrons is second to none and the main reason for our continued success and you richly deserve all the accolades that come your way.

On the green our successes have again been many and varied, with the highlights being the inclusion of Jesse Noronha in the Australian Jackaroos squad, joining his Gorillas team-mate Aaron Teys and the debut of the Illawarra Gorillas in the Bowls Premier League. To Jeremy Henry, Leif Selby, Trevor Wells, Dallas Delatorre and all our bowls officials, players and supporters, thank you and go the Gorillas. Details of all our on green success can be found in the Bowls Reports.

To all our members who suffered bereavement during the year, please accept my sincerest condolences.

Finally to our most important stakeholders, our members: thank you for your continued support and friendship and I'll see you at the Club.

Gorilla TV will showcase not only spectacular bowls at the major tournaments we hold at the Club, but also our fantastic bowls facility to the rest of the World.

Both the Ladies and Men have had great years in pennants, with the ladies winning the number one and number three district flags and, coincidentally, the men also winning the number one (making it seven titles in a row) and number three district flags. Congratulations to all concerned. The State pennant competitions are due to be held after this report is written, so best of luck to all concerned and by the time you read this there may be another State pennant flag (or more) flying proudly at the Club.

The success the Club has enjoyed during the year is the fruit that comes from the labours of all our bowls officials. To our Bowls Coordinator Jeremy Henry (who won a record sixth World Cup this year), Bowls Secretary Trevor Wells, Assistant Bowls Secretary Dallas Delatorre, Junior Bowls Development Officer Leif Selby and all our bowls officials, thank you for all your hard work during the year.

To members who have lost loved ones during the year, please accept my deepest sympathies.

To our bowling members, thank you for your support and go the Gorillas.
